

## CO CURRICULAR PROGRAMS

**1. Music:** instruments, Band, Orchestra and Choir performances.

## A LEVEL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Mock grades are acceptable for provisional admission
2. A minimum of five credits (grade C /5 and above) in IGCSE exams
3. Students will be expected to pick four subjects at AS and finally three at A level.
4. A partial tuition scholarship for academic excellence and talent.
5. Interviews will be held virtually or in-person.

## Cambridge A Level develops learners' knowledge, understanding and skills in:

- In-depth subject content.
- Independent thinking.
- Applying knowledge and understanding to new, as well as familiar situations.
- Handling and evaluating different types of information source.
- Thinking logically and presenting ordered and coherent arguments.
- Making judgments, recommendations and decisions.
- Presenting reasoned explanations, understanding implications and communicating them logically and clearly.
- Working and communicating in English.

**All the subjects help to impart knowledge, skills and attitudes to enable learners pursue any course at university level.**



## ASSESSMENTS

Cambridge International A Level is typically a two-year course. Learners take all papers of the Cambridge International A Level course in the same examination session, in June at the end of the course. The highest grade is an **A\*** and the lowest acceptable grade is an **E**. Results are issued in August
